RE: Government Vehicles – Expired Temporary Permits

[This is the latest in a series of procedural updates. These updates deal with specific MVD procedures and practices. Managers and Supervisors should consistently distribute the updates to all personnel and integrate them into regular information and training sessions.]

State agencies that come to your office with an expired temporary permit for a government vehicle should be routinely given an additional no-fee permit for an additional 30 days.

Because state agencies may not receive their (G) before their temporary permit expires, those agencies may need temporary tags for some of their vehicles for an additional 30 days.

Government agencies with vehicles that have not received their G plates, and that have expired 30-day temporary permits, are directed to take the expired tags to their local state or county-municipal MVD office for additional no-fee 30-day temporary permits.

MVD agents should use the information on the expired temporary tags to fill out the new temporary permits, and should issue the new permits without charging any fee.
