



LIST OF ACCEPTABLE DOCUMENTS FOR STANDARD DRIVER'S LIC/ID ISSUANCE

All documents must be unexpired and valid

To be published revised rule 18.19.5.15 NMAC provides that the documents listed below are acceptable as proof of identity and age for non-commercial standard driver's license and standard identification cards not intended for federal purposes after May 3, 2023.

Documents that Establish Proof of Identity and Age

Applicant MUST also provide two proofs of New Mexico residency.

Note: Applicants can use one of the documents above if it contains the applicant's name and date of birth to provide documentary proof of their identity and age. If the document does not contain the applicant's name and date of birth two of the above documents will be required.

LIST OF ACCEPTABLE DOCUMENTS FOR REAL ID COMPLIANT AND NON COMPLIANT CREDENTIALS

All documents must be unexpired and valid

To be published revised rule 18.19.5.15 NMAC provides that the documents listed below are acceptable as proof of NM Residency for non-commercial standard driver's license and standard identification cards not intended for federal purposes after May 3, 2023.

LIST B

Documents that Establish Proof of NM Residency

In conjunction with LIST A, the application must also provide two (2) of the following documents with the same physical address to establish proof of New Mexico Residency: Documents can be from the same category below, but not from the same entity.	
1. Current real property rental or purchase agreement	8. Original documents from a city, county, state, tribal or federal government organization attesting to the fact that the applicant is a New Mexico resident
<i>The following documents must be dated within 60 days:</i> 2 Utility bill; Does not include cell phone bills	9. New Mexico medical assistance card with address on card, letter from issuing agency that came with card showing name and address, or profile printout from issuing agency.
3. Insurance bill, card, or binder dated within the past 6 months	10. New Mexico public assistance card with address on card, letter from issuing agency that came with card showing name and address, or profile printout from issuing agency.
<i>The following documents must be dated within 60 days:</i> 4. Bank or credit card statement	11. Documents indicating membership in a NM religious organization provided applicant is less than 18 years of age
<i>The following documents must be dated within 60 days:</i> 5. Employment pay stub containing applicant's name and address	12. Documents indicating membership in a NM sports organization provided applicant is less than 18 years of age
6. Local property tax statement	13. If the applicant is less than 18 years of age, an affidavit from the applicant's parent or guardian stating that the applicant lives with that person, as long as the affidavit is accompanied by the parent/guardian's New Mexico Identification card, or two proofs of residency of the parent/guardian
<i>The following documents must be dated within 60 days:</i> 7. Documentation from an education institution such as a transcript, report card or enrollment confirmation.	14. Document evidencing eligibility and proof that the applicant is currently receiving services from a non-profit organization qualified pursuant to Section 501(c)(3) of the Federal Internal Revenue Code of 1986 provided the document displays the applicant's address

NOTE: Applicants for a DL or ID card not acceptable for federal purposes who are homeless or in temporary lodging and unable to provide two of the documents identified in List B may provide an affidavit or notarized letter from a representative of a New Mexico governmental entity, not-for-profit organization, assisted care facility/home, adult assisted living facility/home, homeless shelter, transitional service provider, or group/halfway house certifying to the address where the applicant resides or receives services in lieu of the requirements in List B.

PROTEST: Section 66-2-17 NMSA 1978 of the Motor Vehicle Code provides a formal process for resolving disputes. Protests must be submitted within 30 days of the mailing or verbal notification of the action proposed to be taken by the Department. The protest must be in writing. For further information on how to protest refer to Taxation and Revenue Department FYI-702.

Linking Documents

- Marriage certificates, divorce decrees, court orders, adoption or other court records are considered linking documents.
- Linking documents linking the current legal name to name on identity document must be submitted.
- Linking documents may be used to tie name on ID number document to legal name.
- Linking documents may be used to tie name on residency documents to legal name.

Suffixes

- ID Number (DOB verifies in SSOLV) and Residency Documents
 - May include, omit, or abbreviate the suffix (i.e. "Sr." and "Jr."); and
 - May include, omit or abbreviate your middle name.
